years where we participated in the Independence Day celebrations with other Indian organizations.

• One of the key goals of the current EC is to include as many members into our activities as we can. As explained by Bandaru Rajarao garu, each EC trustee represents a committee and they can recruit as many active members into each committee as they need. • Speaking of Telugu Jyothi, our goal is to make this bimonthly TFAS publication self-supporting. I want to thank TJ Editorial Committee, led by Bhavaraju Murty garu, for their hard work over the years and thank the sponsors for their continued support. The Literary event this month included a meet & greet session with Hasya Brahma Sankara Narayana garu on Saturday, May 22nd at Sri Venkateswara Temple in Bridgewater.

Hasyavadhani Mr. Sankara Narayana, well known as Hasya Brahma, is an international Artist and veteran journalist. He is Limca Book Double Record holder for his Hasyavadhanam. He is a multi talented journalist, columnist, writer, speaker, TV showman, researcher besides a post

graduate in Telugu. He has been in the field of Telugu Journalism for 28 years. He has been working as Chief Sub-Editor in EENADU Telugu Daily. Earlier he worked as Chief Sub Editor in Andhra Prabha, Krishna Patrika and TV Channel CTV. He has the distinction of contributing 30 columns in Journalism. He has published 11 books to his credit.

The event started at 3:00 PM on a bright day, with the sun shining and sunlight pouring into a room packed full of guests waiting to hear the artist speak.

Radha Kasinadhuni garu started the program by introducing the goals of the literary program followed by Dr. Raja Rao garu introducing the artist to an audience that comprised of several prominent members of the Telugu community, many of them illustrious literary artists in their own right. Large portions of the audience were current and past TFAS committee members who were instrumental in promoting Telugu culture and literature in USA.

If the sun was bright, the artist was brighter, and easily outdid the sun in warmth with witty and humorous anecdotes interspersing his two hours of talk on the art and science of comedy. He invited the audience members to provide any statement on any subject, and promptly turned them into a humorous moment. At other moments, he regaled the audience with narratives of his interactions with various luminaries in the world of Telugu arts and literature, as well as the sometimes inexplicable world of Telugu politics. TFAS was represented by Usha Akella and Sudhakar Uppala and felicitated the artist at the end of the program.
